

Greetings!

During this past month several Chamber board members and myself had the opportunity to attend the ribbon cutting ceremony for the Barclaycard customer service center expansion in Wilton. This demonstrated a company's desire to not only employ Maine workers, but to invest in the community.

The expansion project resulted in a \$5-million renovation to the old Bass Shoe building. The renovations alone put added money into the local economy through employment of local contractors. Now they are hiring an additional 150 employees putting their total over 350. Senator Susan Collins in her

remarks challenged them to grow to 500 employees in the near future.

What I found particularly gratifying was the work of Jenn McEntee, managing director, who works to make Barclaycard a part of the local economy as well as the local community. She worked this past year with two elementary school teachers (Leslie Kaiser and Brenda Laverdier) from Academy Hill School on a program called "Kids Can."

This program works with 25 elementary students in grades 3, 4 and 5 to better connect them with school. Part of the program brings these students up to Foster CTE Center at the Mt. Blue Campus to spend two days in several of our career and technical education programs. Over this past year, students received

a tour of the Mt. Blue Campus on their first visit. Then they spent two days each in Culinary Arts (Sean Minear), Commercial Arts and Photography (Charlie Fontaine), Digital Media (Chris Davis) and Pre Engineering (Jake Bogar).

All of these instructors had the students create a project while hearing about careers related to the program. In addition, teachers emphasized the importance of the academic subjects the students are taking in school. High school students from Foster CTE Center assisted in the activities.

Barclaycard helped to fund the program as well as provided some of their employees as mentors. This program not only builds the connection between education and careers, but it motivates these elementary students to do better in school. It also creates a sense of ownership by our high school students as part of our community.

The ribbon cutting ceremony in Wilton was topped off with a tour of the newly renovated Barclaycard facility. While walking through the building you can see large photos of the Barclay employees working with Academy Hill elementary students in programs at Foster CTE Center. Part of the economy and part of the community.

The University of Maine at Farmington is also working on making the connections between education, community and careers. Here is a summary of some of the ways that UMF has partnered with the community. This overview was sent to me by Peter A. Through internships, volunteerism, leadership education, service learning, and undergraduate research, the Partnership provides opportunities for students to develop new skills and knowledge in the "real world," while also supplying organizations with additional human capital to meet their goals and take on new projects.
